This weekend, I share the news that later this year we will be entering into the process known as Renew My Church. It is an effort by the Archdiocese to bring vitality and life back into our faith communities. As a part of this process, our parish has been grouped together with the parishes of St. Henry, St. Timothy, and Blessed Andrew Stepinac Croatian Catholic Mission.

The process of Renew My Church for us is scheduled to start in the summer of this year. But, as early as the spring of this year, our parishes are supposed "to get to know" one another. In some ways, we have already been doing this. For example, for many years there has been a group of lay leaders from the various parishes of the area who meet regularly in what are called Deanery Meetings to share information and address the needs of the area. I am grateful that we have at least two parishioners who have been serving faithfully in these Deanery Meetings.

Another example will take place this coming May 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019 when the parishes of St. Henry and St. Timothy will send their candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation to join us in one multi-parish and multi-lingual Confirmation Liturgy with Bishop Alberto Rojas. This year, our parish had enough candidates to qualify us for a bishop to come and administer the Sacrament of Confirmation to our young candidates. Unfortunately, neither the parishes of St. Henry or St. Timothy had enough of their own candidates to qualify. So they have asked to join. We were glad to accommodate them and all are looking forward for the opportunity.

To return, though, to the Renew My Church process, it will involve conversations between the pastoral leadership of all four communities to assess the needs of the Catholic faithful in our part of Rogers Park. We will be talking honestly and seriously about our current and future challenges, the assets and resources that each parish community currently has, and finally to evaluate how the four parishes in our grouping might together better proclaim the gospel and the Catholic faith in this local area.

At this point, I will be frank and honest. I am sure that many of you have already heard about the Renew My Church process taking place in other parts of the Archdiocese. I am sure that some of you may have been distressed by the news of parishes having to merge or even close. As you now hear that SMM will be entering into the same process, I know the first question in your minds is simply, will the same thing happen to us?

I can respond with "I do not know" which is the honest truth. But, I would rather like to respond by saying, "That is not necessarily the healthiest approach to the process." As we hear the news all over the Archdiocese of parishes being merged and/or closed, I know that everyone in the four parishes of our grouping have the same fear. Yes, that is a possibility but again, Renew My Church is not simply a matter of deciding which parishes will close/merge. The goal is to figure out the best way our four communities might collaboratively spread and proclaim the gospel message as well as teach and celebrate the Catholic.

The days are gone when every parish can sustain its own youth ministry, its own Minister of Care ministry, its own this group or that group, etc. The resources of every parish have become limited and the time has come to figure out what resources we can share and better fulfill the gospel mission that has been entrusted to our communities. So, in essence, this is the goal of the Renew My Church process and this is what I would like all of us to keep in our minds as we enter into the process.

The process again is scheduled to begin by this summer. The conversations are supposed to last for the remainder of the year and hopefully in early 2020 we will have come to a consensus of what needs to happen in our particular area of Rogers Park. At this point, though, I do not know what that might be and the future will always bring challenges. But it will also invite us to enter into a renewed sense of who we are called to be as disciples of Jesus. Until we get to that bridge, let us pray that our faith will be strong when life seems easy so that when life becomes a little challenging, we will not lose faith.



## CYCLES OF FAITH

### 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel is one of tension and contradiction. We enter the scene at the local synagogue. It is near the beginning of Jesus' earthly ministry, and he has returned home to Nazareth for a short while. There, in the midst of the men who watched him grow up and who played with him as a boy in the dusty streets, Jesus proclaims that he is the fulfillment of the Messianic prophecies of Isaiah. The response is understandably mixed. "All spoke highly of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They also asked, 'Isn't this the son of Joseph?'"

Jesus reminds them - none too gently - of the Israelites' rejection of the prophets throughout history. Not only did the people ignore Elijah and Elisha, but they worked miracles among the pagans instead. Then comes the rage. "They rose up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town had been built, to hurl him down headlong."

No one likes to be reminded of their own faults. In the deeply religious Jewish society, nobody wanted to be the unfaithful one. Jesus exposes the sins of the community, and it drives them not to conversion, but to rage. We can consider our own time. How often, when someone is contracted, do they quickly resort to anger, name-calling, and undermining the reputation of the other? How quickly we want to destroy! This Sunday, we ought to consider our own lives. Do we listen to the prophetic voices around us, even when they threaten to upturn our expectations? If we hear something difficult, something that reminds us of our own sin, do we accept the opportunity to prayerfully ponder? If we allow ourselves to be open to the prophetic voices in our own lives, we'll notice that God speaks through the unexpected, if we have ears to hear it.
