The first thing I would like to share with parishioners again this weekend is a brief update of our stained glass window project. You may have noticed that work continued on the windows even before we began our Summer Collection.

In all honesty, I had to take a little bit of a risk. With our donor's commitment to match this year's Summer Collection, it seemed like a good possibility that we would have enough money to complete all of the windows. So I went ahead and had our window contractor continue with the rest of the stained glass windows on the east and west sides of church. I know it was a little bit of a risk to have the work started without being certain that we would have the funds on hand but I had faith in the parish that we would come through with our commitment and dedication to this faith community. To this date, we have gotten closer to our goal of \$35K (currently \$32,061.14) and donations are still coming in for the Summer Collection. So it all paid off for us in the end. Again, it is all thanks to all of you parishioners!

I would like to change gears at this point and share with you the life of a saint that the Church will celebrate this coming Wednesday, August 28th—the feast day of St. Augustine of Hippo. St. Augustine truly is an inspiration for all who are in search of the truth.

St. Augustine was born in northern Africa. His father was a pagan but his mother was a Christian who happens to be St. Monica whose feast day is the day before her son's. St. Augustine was far from a model son in his youth. He gave his mother every sort of headache a mother can imagine. The one wish that St. Monica had was to see her son be baptized a Catholic Christian. However, St. Augustine would have none of it. Instead, he searched for truth in every place but the Church. He also engaged in earthly pleasures of all kinds. He even fathered a son out of wedlock. St. Augustine, by all counts, was a rebellious child who gave his mother so much grief causing her to shed so many tears over her son.

There was a time in his life when St. Augustine tried to run away from his mother. He left for a distant land and told his mother nothing about his plans. However, St. Monica somehow managed to track him down and followed after him. If St. Augustine was persistent in his rebellious nature, St. Monica was just as equally persistent in praying for the conversion of her son.

Eventually, St. Augustine reached a point in his life that could be described as "rock bottom." He had sought the truth in every philosophical school of the time. He had sought for the meaning of life in every other aspect except the faith. He had engaged in earthly pleasures from material to sexual. In the end, St. Augustine experienced dryness in his life that he could not explain. It was at that moment when St. Augustine was prepared for his moment of conversion.

St. Augustine heard the voice of a child in the distance joyfully chanting over and over, "Take up and read." St. Augustine picked up Sacred Scripture and opened to the first passage he chanced upon leading him to one of St. Paul's letters in which was written that earthly pleasures would not give meaning to life but, ultimately, it would only be by putting on the Lord Jesus Christ. From that point on, St. Augustine's life turned around. He not only accepted baptism but eventually he became a priest and ultimately a bishop. He is also considered to be one of the Doctors of the Church—that is, someone whose writings and teachings have become extremely influential in the formulation of Christian faith and doctrine.

St. Augustine's life reminds us that it is not necessarily always the holiest person that becomes a saint. Ultimately, it is the one who allows one's faith in God to become the absolute foundation of one's life. St. Augustine coined a very well-known phrase, "Our hearts are restless until they rest in you, O Lord." Again, he reminds us that no matter where we may look, there is no one or nothing that can ever satisfy our yearnings in life more than God.

May St. Augustine pray for all of us as we search for the truth in God alone.

RCIA and the Search for God

Are you searching for God? Do you, or someone you know, feel a calling toward the Catholic Church?

RCIA – the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults – is a program for adults who are considering entering the Catholic Church or for baptized Catholics who wish to complete the Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Eucharist and Confirmation). We also welcome Catholics who would like to study their faith more deeply.

In RCIA, we talk about the presence of God in our lives and in the world. We share our faith and pray. We study Scripture and how it relates and speaks to us today. We learn about the Church, its beliefs, and its sacraments. We explore what it means to be Catholic and to live a Christian life. We learn from each other as we journey together on a pilgrimage of faith.

RCIA sessions will take place on Monday from 7:00 p.m. until 8:15 p.m. in McCarthy Hall (7325 N. Claremont Avenue). The introductory class meets on Monday, September 9. RCIA culminates with the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 11, 2020.

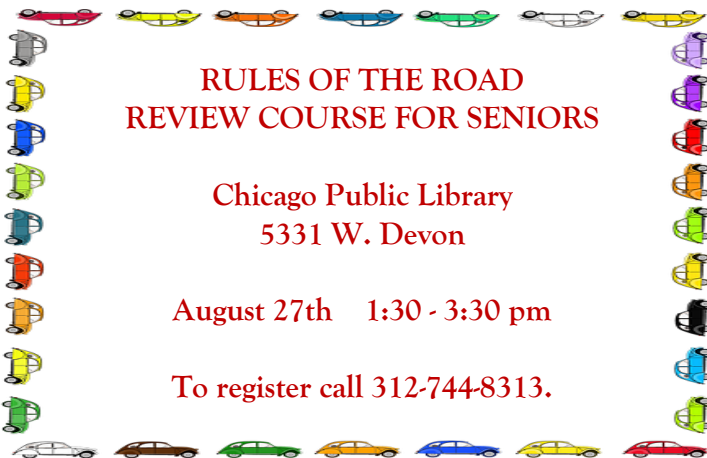
ADULT CO-ED VOLLEYBALL

how far he strayed. Augustine became swept

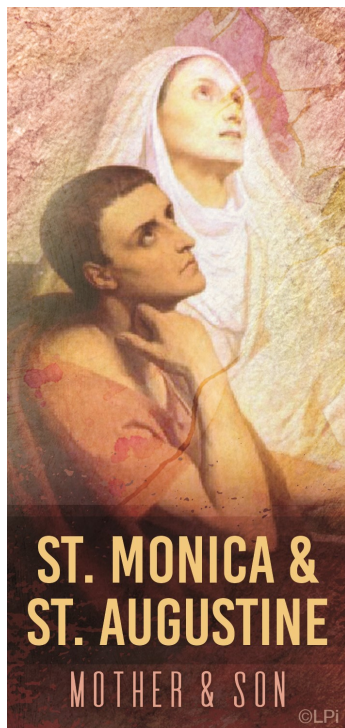
up in heresy, a false form of Christianity. He lived with a mistress and
