The Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year A

In today's Gospel, Matthew 18: 15-20, Jesus offers a practical solution for disputes among the loved ones.

If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, so that 'every fact may be established on the testimony of two or three witnesses.' If he refuses to listen to them, tell the church. If he refuses to listen even to the church, then treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector. (Matthew 18: 15-17)

The main point of this Sunday's Gospel is that we need each other, both for reconciliation and for good spiritual health. We are brothers and sisters of each other. And our God expects us to support, love and even correct one another when the time is appropriate.

Working with each other is not only a good way to achieve our goals in life; it is also the heart of what Jesus wants from all of us. It is what "church" mean. It is a place for all. We come together because of God's love and the love among all members. We must help one another when and where help is needed.

Is it that the goal for our faith community – Holy Child Jesus Parish - that is for good spiritual health? All of us, who were members of three different communities, are now belonged to just one. We want our parish like a home for all with much love and care for each other - the parish that has many living witnesses for our loving God; the parish that will bring forth many vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Again, amen, I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father. For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them. (Matthew 18: 19-20)

These words were from our Lord Jesus Christ. We believe that when two or three are gathered in the name of God, He is there in our midst. Let us join hands with each other for the good spiritual health of our parish.

RCIA and the Search for God

Are you searching for God? Do you, or someone you know, feel a calling toward the Catholic Church?

RCIA—the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults—is a program for adults who are considering entering the Catholic Church and have not been baptized, for baptized non-Catholic Christians who wish to join the Catholic Church, or for baptized Catholics who wish to complete their Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Eucharist and Confirmation). We also welcome Catholics who would like to study their faith more deeply.

In RCIA, we talk about the presence of God in our lives and in the world. We share our faith and pray. We study Scripture and how it speaks to us today. We learn about the Church, its beliefs, and its sacraments. We explore what it means to be Catholic and to live a Christian life. We learn from each other as we journey together on a pilgrimage of faith.

RCIA sessions will begin in early October. We are determining if the sessions will be in-person with social distancing, remote, or a hybrid. If you have a preference, please let us know. Your input is valuable to us.

Please consider RCIA if you have been contemplating entering the Church or completing your Sacraments of Initiation. You may know someone who has inquired about the Church or has not completed the Sacraments of Initiation. Spread the good news!

What Will the Religious Education Program Look Like This Year?

This year's Religious Education program will differ greatly from that of previous years due to the uncertainty brought by the coronavirus pandemic. Classes will be family catechesis at home, supported by monthly Zoom-based classes based on the Finding God textbook materials published by Loyola Press.

2020-2021 Religious Education Plan Summary of Key Features

We meet on Zoom one Saturday a month for about an hour.

This monthly meeting includes a presentation to prepare you for the coming month's topics. Students may attend the first part of the meeting with their parents.

Meetings will be recorded (per safe-environment guidelines) and will be available upon request to families unable to attend on a day.

On the other (two) three weeks of the month, families designate their own Religious Education time, and work together at home. All grade levels cover the same theme each week, but with age-appropriate resources for each child.

We will provide you a parent guide for every grade level that will help you ask questions as your children work through their material.

Catechists will be available for consultation or support.

The first parent-catechist Zoom meeting will be on Saturday, October 10, 2020 at the time jointly agreed upon by parents and catechists.

The last at home class will be during the week of March 21-27, 2021. However, children in 2nd year Communion preparation and 2nd year Confirmation preparation will have additional Zoom classes with catechists in April and May 2021 to prepare for their reception of the Sacraments.

Preschool-K

Until it becomes prudent and possible to have in person classes, we will simply be unable to offer catechesis for Preschool-K children.

Tuition & Fees

Tuition is waived this school year. However, there is a textbook fee of \$25.00 per student. Sacramental Preparation fee is TBD.

FOCUS ON THE WORD

CYCLES OF FAITH

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's all about reconciliation and conversion, not punishment. Relationships are not static adventures but wonderful gifts that continue to develop, grow, change, and mature. We are meant to be social beings, so isolating ourselves from others is rarely helpful. But, because human beings are on the one hand tremendously gifted, talented, and blessed creations, they are on the other also flawed, broken, and sinful. We all need to humbly admit that we are works in progress and not only capable of enriching each other's lives but causing deep hurts and wounds as well. Hence, we always need to be reconciled. We are always growing, changing, and expanding our knowledge of who we are and how we are meant to share life together.

Because reconciliation and conversion are always part of the mix of life, honesty is crucial. Without honesty, we can easily find ourselves living a lie and causing more harm than good. Being able to freely share our feelings, especially those involving pain and hurt, is a charism necessary to pursue and an art to learn. When we are wronged or wrong someone else, we do not enjoy the confrontation that can and needs to come. We are taught to keep our feelings to ourselves, especially when they are negative, and we tend to avoid difficult conversations. Hence, we never really learn how to confront another, successfully resolve conflict, find reconciliation, and welcome conversion. When we hurt or wrong someone, it does not mean that we are a bad or sinful person who deserves only punishment and excommunication. Quite the opposite! We are simply a human person who can make poor choices and sin and can be forgiven. We can restore and deepen the relationship that has been affected and find our way home again.

Jesus clearly wants to avoid shame because it has no purpose in achieving reconciliation and conversion. All broken relationships deserve a chance at reconciliation. Every person has room for growth and a need for conversion. We have to learn to be okay with honesty and not be afraid to hear and process what someone needs to say, even if it is difficult for us to hear. Severing a relationship, both personally or with the church community as a whole, ought to definitely be a last resort and only pursued when all else has failed.




TOWN HALL MEETINGS
