First Sunday of Advent - Year B

With the First Sunday of Advent, we start a new liturgical year. Advent is the season in stillness wait and of preparation. The waiting here means to be ready to welcome the second coming of Jesus Christ our Lord. And the preparation means to prepare our whole being to celebrate Christmas, the birth of Jesus Christ, Son of the Most High.

The Holy Scriptures of this First Sunday of Advent address on the second coming of Christ the Lord in his glory to judge the living and the dead.

Jesus said to his disciples: "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. It is like a man traveling abroad. He leaves home and places his servants in charge, each with his own work, and orders the gatekeeper to be on the watch. Watch, therefore; you do not know when the Lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or in the morning. May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to all: 'Watch!'" (Mark 13: 33-37).

Even though living amidst the harshness of this world, we often think that the life that we are having right now is eternal, is all. We seem not to pay much intention to the reality that nothing in this world will remain forever. Countless generations have lived in this world before us. For each of us, we were once young, and now aged. Indeed, life in this world will pass, only the life with God will last forever.

Are we ready for the coming of our Lord? May the teachings of Our Lord Jesus help each of us to look more closely at our preparation for the Second Coming of the Son of God in his glory.

Advent

The new liturgical year begins today with the first Sunday in Advent. Advent is much more than the shopping season before Christmas. Advent is a time of anticipation, not for the presents that we may give and receive, but for the celebration of the coming of Jesus. Advent is a time of reflection when we think about the meaning of God incarnated into the human person Jesus, who lived exactly as we do with the sole exception of sin. Advent is a time of reflection where we recall the circumstance of the birth of our Lord. Jesus was not born into luxury as a glorious prince, but into humble surroundings as an ordinary human child, a helpless baby completely dependent upon his parents. And Advent is a time of hope, a time where we can help bring Jesus's light into the world. Let's take a break from the shopping and the craziness this Advent and think about God's gift to us in the person of Jesus. That's a gift we can truly celebrate.

Throughout our Advent celebration, we continue to come together as Holy Child Jesus Parish. We know that many of us are still saddened because of our experiencing losses of relationships and celebrations in our former parishes. While this sadness is part of who we are and what we bring to our unified parish, we must not let it define us. For Advent is also a time of renewal. We are working to prepare and construct our new relationships and celebrations in Holy Child Jesus Parish even though this work has been hindered by the pandemic. But this work has only been hindered; this work has not and will not stop as we await the continuing coming together of Holy Child Jesus into one community and one church. As we anticipate the coming of the Holy Child Jesus into our lives during Advent, let us also eagerly anticipate, await, and rejoice in our new community of Holy Child Jesus Parish.



FOCUS ON THE WORD

CYCLES OF FAITH First Sunday of Advent

You are at the eye doctor and it's time for the peripheral vision test. You know the one. It's where you put your head up to a contraption and have to click a switch every time you see a squiggly line. If you don't concentrate and maintain optimal focus, you will miss them and skew the outcome of the test. You can easily find yourself with a diagnosis that really isn't accurate! Concentration and focus are key to succeeding with this evaluation. They are also key to developing a healthy, vibrant spiritual life. If we do not bring our full consciousness to the task, concentrate with all our might, be watchful and vigilant, we are not going to see God's loving presence flashing before our eyes!

That's why we need Advent. Let's face it. We can easily get distracted, focus on nonessential and superficial things and lose touch with what really matters. Our attentions wander. We daydream and even become a bit overwhelmed and tired. All of the stresses and demands of life consume us and we find ourselves constantly trying to play catch up rather than relishing the moment of the now. "Now" moments are so fleeting. They flash before us like those squiggly lines on a screen. Present moments go as quickly as they come but it is important to discover them and rest in them as often as we can. Though gone in a flash, these now moments of encounter with God teach powerful lessons and offer a grounding in truth that can be found nowhere else. It's the grace of Advent to become watchful and attentive because we are never sure when God will surprise us.

God loves surprises and love thrives on them! God's now moments of surprises come as tender instants of intimate connection where I find profound peace, experience joy, and rest in love. These are Advent times reflective of the now moments when Christ first was born, when God surprises us during every time we care to watch and when the great surprise of Christ's second coming dawns upon us all. But, to discover the grandeur and experience the awe of these now times, we have to be ready. We have to want to be there. We have to believe. And, we have to have the desire to soak in as much as we can in the time we have before us.
