Second Sunday of Advent – Year B

Studying the four Gospels, we notice that St. Mark was the only Evangelist who began his writing with these words "*The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God.*" (Mk 1:1) He then introduced to his readers John the Baptist who was sent to prepare the people of his day for Jesus' public ministry. The message from John is also needed for each of us as we are going into the Second Week of the Advent Season.

"John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." (Mk 1:4)

He knew that before the hearts of his listeners would be ready to receive the Good News of their salvation, they needed to humbly repent of sins, and get rid of pride.

John's message was received by the people.

People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. (Mark 1:5)

Truly, all generations need to heed the message from John, especially us who are living in this challenging world. We have been deceived by the promise that this earthly life can offer us everything.

The reality is that this world cannot give us anything. Things that the world can give us are chaos, suffering, or hatred. Indeed, only in and with Jesus we can have everything. We know that our Lord always keeps His promises. The promises of peace, love, salvation and eternal life first preached by Jesus to the people of the Judean countryside and the inhabitants of Jerusalem have remained for all generations of Christ's followers.

If only then with open-heart and open-mind we heed the call of John the Baptist to repent, to come out of our darkness and walk into God's Light, and to live fully His teachings in word and action, we are giving ourselves as well as God a chance to bring God's promises to fulfillment. May the message of this second Sunday of Advent - *Repent* in order to receive forgiveness - stir us up and lead us into repentance.



CYCLES OF FAITH 2nd Sunday of Advent

People knew over a year in advance that the Pope was coming for a visit to America and the preparations began. Security, space limitations and requirements, protocols, crowd management, itineraries, invitations, regulations, and so much more was necessary to pull this event off effectively. It's not every day that we get a visit from such a prominent dignitary. Thought, effort, meticulous attention to detail and vision all are necessary to make this thing work. After all, he can't just show up in the ordinary and normal daily routines of life and catch people unprepared! Tickets have to be purchased, buses rented, hotel rooms reserved, and travel arrangements made early because it will be impossible to see him if we wait too long!

We do this kind of preparing not only for prominent religious figures but for political dignitaries, notable sports figures, people of fame, and even actors. If an individual intrigues us, we are going to want to do all we have to do to get a "good seat" in the house. Does Jesus Christ captivate this much of our attention? We are asked to prepare the way of the Lord and to do so not with frantic frenzy but patient enthusiasm. We do not have to stand on a street corner making profound announcements about God's coming or become overly zealous in our embrace of the Good News. Our task is quieter, more interior, captivating, and consuming. We are asked to change. We have to conduct our lives with holy devotion.

Is the cost of that ticket too much for you? Don't you want the "best seat" in the house? You don't want to miss Our Lord's arrival when he comes, do you? After all, if he comes while you are going about your daily routines without you even knowing, he may catch you off guard. Or, he may come in disguise looking like a beggar, a prisoner, migrant, refugee, or someone who is lost. Would you be ready to recognize him then? Preparing for the coming of Christ requires a change of mind, heart, and behavior. It is not adequate to simply do the things we always do. We want our lives to speak of the exciting news of Christ's coming and the joy that the Gospel brings. It has to do with our demeanor, values, priorities, choices, and how we structure daily routines. Of course, it involves sacrifice. All anticipations do! Are you excited, captivated, enthusiastic, and sitting on the edge of your seat eager to celebrate his coming among us at Christmas, and waiting for him to come again? If not, why not? of Advent
